Frequently Asked Questions about Measure E

What is Measure E?

Measure E is a sales tax and it would enact a 0.75% (¾ cent) transaction and use tax that would generate approximately \$3.75 million in FY 2019-2020 and approximately \$5 million per year thereafter. All funds would stay in Glendora and enable the City to continue to provide services at the levels expected by the community.

Why is Measure E needed?

The City of Glendora has declared a fiscal emergency because current fiscal projections show expenditures will continue to outpace revenues in the Glendora General Fund.

How does Measure work?

Measure E is a ¾ cent “sales tax”: for every \$10 spent, 7 and 1/2 cents will be taxed.

Are there any exemptions? Food and medicine are exempt from Measure E.

When is the Measure E election? The election is scheduled for Tuesday March 5, 2019

Who is supporting Measure E?

Measure E enjoys broad community support including the entire Glendora City Council, City Manager, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Glendora City Employees and the Glendora Chamber of Commerce. For a list of supporters visit: www.YesOnEGlendora.com
